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Objective: The course is designed to examine the origins, development, functions and problems of international organizations. We will inquire into the politics involved in the life of these entities, with special emphasis on the UN and the EU. Other varieties of international organization: governmental and non-governmental, regional and issue specific institutions will also be examined. At the end of the semester it is expected that the student should be able to identify, understand, analyze and assess the increasingly important role played by IO's in the contemporary world.

COVID-19 Statement

In your choice for an organization, <u>DO NOT SELECT THE UN OR THE EU</u>, which serve as sources of most of our examples. Your final grade will be determined according to this formula:
