Graduate Assistantships

Graduate assistantships are offered to qualified fultime graduate students for a maximum of two years and include a tuition waiver and stipend.

Graduate Minor

Students can enhance their Graduate School experience at LSU by completing a graduate minor in one of the following areas: art history, English, French, geography and enthropology, history, linguistics, women's studies, and more.

Application Process

Prospective students must complete an online application with the LSU Graduate School. The first step is to create an account. Applicants must submit the following information to the Graduate School:

- Complete application form
- Application fee
- Official transcripts from all universities attended (in English)
- GRE scores (sent by testing service)
- . CV (in English or Spanish)
- 3 letters of recommendation (in English or Spanish, uploaded by references)
- Statement of purpose (in English or Spanish)
 Writing sample in Spanish (university-level
- Writing sample in Spanish (university-level escay)
- International applicants must also submit a TOEFL score or equivalent (sent by testing service)
